KATIE, now GABBY, by Patty Luke-Gysin




Gabby is a true delight. She loves to play tennis ball catch, especially in the snow. She is progressing in her walks. We all share a New Year's Resolution to increase fitness

Dear GRRR:

Early on, he had digestive issues that kept getting worse and often had diarrhea and periodic vomiting. After weeks of seeing the vet and getting no relief for him, I found a new vet who would listen to me. His ultrasound showed inflammation and swelling in his gut. The new diagnosis was stress colitis, which made so much sense. A change of diet to high fiber, daily probiotics, treatment for acid reflux, adding in some nose work to give him some food puzzles to have fun with and to solve successfully...and he became a new, happy boy. He felt so much better in a few short weeks and his personality showed through finally. Today, he's a happy, waggy, goofy boy.

Barley has adapted to our family really well. He loves all the grandkids and loves to be in the middle of their activity. They love to pet him and cuddle up with him and he eats up the attention. Dear GRRR:


Hi GRRR:

Golden Angel: Bree

This is little, sweet Bree. Bree is short for Breeze – her given name. She is just over three years old and came into GRRR's care last September. Bree has the most beautiful, honey gold coat. She is not a very big girl and she loves to play fetch and snuggle. Bree was adopted as an 8-week-old puppy from a breeder. She was well loved. She grew up to be this beautiful, happy girl. She received good training and was living a very happy life with her human Mom.

Golden Retrievers can have a genetic tendency for increased inflammation in their joints. Over-breeding can exacerbate this. If there is inflammation in the knee, over time it increasingly frays the ligaments until they can tear or even rupture. One day, you can have a happy, healthy and active dog. And the next day he or she is limping badly without any obvious injury.

This is likely what happened to sweet, little Bree. You see, she loves to play fetch and run in short bursts. One day, her owner noticed some limping. She let her rest and thought she was OK and continued playing fetch because it made Bree so happy. After a few days, Bree's limping was considerably worse, and she was in obvious pain when she tried to stand and walk.

Bree's owner took her to her vet. After examination and X-rays, the vet told her that Bree had two torn anterior cruciate ligaments (ACL), one in each knee. She would always be in some pain and have trouble walking without surgery to repair them. When the vet explained the procedure, the recovery and the cost, Bree's owner,

an older retired person, was crushed. She wanted so much to help her little girl, but she could not afford the surgery, and the physical requirements of helping a dog through the recovery were going to be too much for her.

She made one of the most heartbreaking but loving decisions a responsible dog owner can make. She decided she had to get Bree to someone who could make sure she would get the care she needed and deserved. With a heavy heart, she contacted Mary Kenton and told her Bree's story. As always, Mary was very caring and reassuring. She told her that GRRR would absolutely take Bree in and that, because of our Golden Angel Fund, we would make sure that Bree was able to have the surgery she needs. She could stay at GRRR as long as it would take to recuperate and for us to find her the best possible new home.

With sadness and love, Bree was brought to GRRR. She immediately fit right in with the gang at Phoebe's Place. Bree looks like she could be the sister of Mary's dog, Molly. The two of them prancing around is quite a sight!

Bree was seen right away by Dr. Carpenter who confirmed that she should go to see an orthopedic specialist. She saw Dr. Bauer at Colorado Canine Orthopedics. Dr. Bauer's diagnosis was that Bree had severe synovitis (inflammation of the joint space) and bilateral tears in her ACLs in both knees. Surgery was scheduled for early in January.

Because Bree is very energetic, Mary felt it best that she go into a foster home so that she could be kept quieter both before and after her surgery. Volunteer Steve Schmidt agreed to take Bree home. Steve has an adorable male Golden named Dusty who is great with other dogs but isn't a big roughhouser. It is a perfect situation for sweet little Bree. Steve says she really enjoys just hanging out with him and Dusty.

Surgery to repair Bree's right knee was conducted on January 4. All went very well. As Dr. Bauer did the surgery, he saw such a large amount of inflammation that he biopsied it to make sure that there wasn't any kind of abnormal tissue present. To date, we are still waiting on the biopsy results. Meanwhile, Steve says Bree is being a good patient. She is still in some pain but slowly getting better. The recovery process is long and requires much help and patience from the human caretaker. At four and eight weeks, x-rays will be done to check on the healing process. When she is fully recuperated, the other knee can be done.

We are hoping that Bree will be adopted soon and that her forever humans will help her through her second surgery, which will be supported by GRRR.

Wrapping up 2021 and Moving into 2022

Here at GRRR we had so many things to be thankful for in 2021! We raised a record amount of money on Colorado Gives Day, \$140,000! It was truly amazing and a testament to all of the amazing supporters we have. Our dog intake was also up from 209 in 2020 to 263 in 2021.

Unfortunately, the Turkey Dog program was put on hold indefinitely due to the CDC banning the import of dogs from 113 countries deemed "high risk for rabies," including Turkey. This ban went into effect in July of 2021. Several rescues, including GRRR, have signed a petition and are lobbying the government in order to get this ban lifted. We are hoping this happens soon, but aren't sure that anything will change for many months. In the meantime, we have shifted our focus to rescuing a higher number of former breeder dogs. In 2021 we rescued 78 former breeder dogs, which is up significantly from years past. While these dogs can be extremely scared and shy, it is beyond rewarding to see what love, patience and time can do for these wonderful dogs.

Also for 2022, we are looking forward to moving back to an in-person Gala event. We will be selling fewer tickets than before and will be moving the auction items upstairs at the Tivoli to create some extra space for everyone to be a little more comfortable. We will also be having a plated dinner as opposed to a buffet, again to create more space for everyone. While the event will be in person, we will also be offering the silent auction on-line for those folks who wish to participate virtually. Things may look a little different for that event, but I have no doubt it will be amazing. \checkmark




